

## EXAM INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE EUROPEAN HUMAN RIGHTS LAW COURSE

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The exam shall be oral and shall consist of a case analysis and a presentation of a topic formulated from an orientation list of questions:

- a) Case analysis shall be done with respect to the facts, which will be served to the student at the exam. The facts of the case and legal issues deriving from it shall be those covered by the Lectures, Practical Work and Reader of the Course. Student's task shall be to present the legal issues of the case and to provide the holding (violation/no violation of the European Convention on Human Rights) and legal reasoning for it on the basis of the European Court of Human Rights case law.
- b) The topic of the presentation shall be formulated at the exam from the following orientation list of questions:

  14. Discrimination – Scope of Application
  15. Proportionality Test in Anti-Discrimination Law
  16. Common European Asylum System - Asylum Procedure

  18. Common European Asylum System - Non-refoulement principle

Student shall have two hours to prepare case analysis and the presentation of the topic. Student shall be allowed to ask the examiner, at any moment of the preparation, to clarify the facts of the case and the topic of the presentation. Student shall be allowed to use different sources including the reader, notes, textbooks, and the Court's judgments. However, any form of communication with a third person during the exam is strictly forbidden. The case analysis and topic presentation should take approximately 10 minutes each.

Student shall be exempted from the case analysis component if he/she was active in all Practical Work classes.

Student is graded on class participation, including attendance, case analysis and topic presentation.
